

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
Empowering Youth through Social Entrepreneurship: Insights from a 10-Day Exchange Program

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Understanding Social Entrepreneurship: Definitions and Characteristics



There is no universally recognized definition for social entrepreneurship. The variety of definitions are provided depending on the geographical placement, state system, and even which type of sector is involved.

Social entrepreneurship applies the principles and guidance used by start-up founders and entrepreneurs to a business that directly generates social change or impacts a social cause.

A social entrepreneur is primarily motivated by a desire to alleviate some kind of systemic social or cultural problem. Social entrepreneurship is a new, innovative business venture that influences change. A social entrepreneur has a specific cause that they care about, and they develop a business model around making a positive impact. The main goal is to create lasting social change through business.

It leverages entrepreneurial principles to drive social change and address systemic issues. Social entrepreneurs focus on creating lasting impacts through innovative business models aimed at solving social or cultural problems.



Definition and Purpose of Social Enterprises

The European Commission defines social enterprises primarily as businesses where the social objective drives the commercial activity. Profits generated are reinvested to further the social goals of the enterprise, ensuring that these organizations prioritize societal benefits over financial gain.



EU's Holistic Approach to Social Enterprises

In contrast, the operational definition of social enterprises by the EU emphasizes three core dimensions: economic (entrepreneurial activities), social (aims and missions related to societal welfare), and inclusive governance (participatory and democratic management structures). This holistic approach ensures that the enterprises not only focus on profit but also foster community engagement and sustainable development.

Self-Discovery

Self-reflection is essential for aspiring entrepreneurs to recognize their strengths, values, interests and motivations, which lays the foundation for authentic ventures.

Identifying Problems Worth Solving

Identifying real-world problems through observation and community engagement enables young entrepreneurs to create impactful and relevant business ideas. Every business idea starts with a need or a problem. Look around you. Ask your friends. What frustrates people? What's missing in your community? From climate issues to education gaps to accessibility — your business can create impact and profit.



Understanding Business Basics

Important terms to explore:

Align with Personal Values


Understanding one's values is essential for aligning business goals with personal beliefs, fostering motivation and commitment. This alignment creates a strong foundation for decision-making and business ethics.


Business Model Templates

Participants also created video advertisements to pitch their ideas, enhancing their storytelling abilities and marketing strategies, crucial components of successful business plans.



SWOT Analysis


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
