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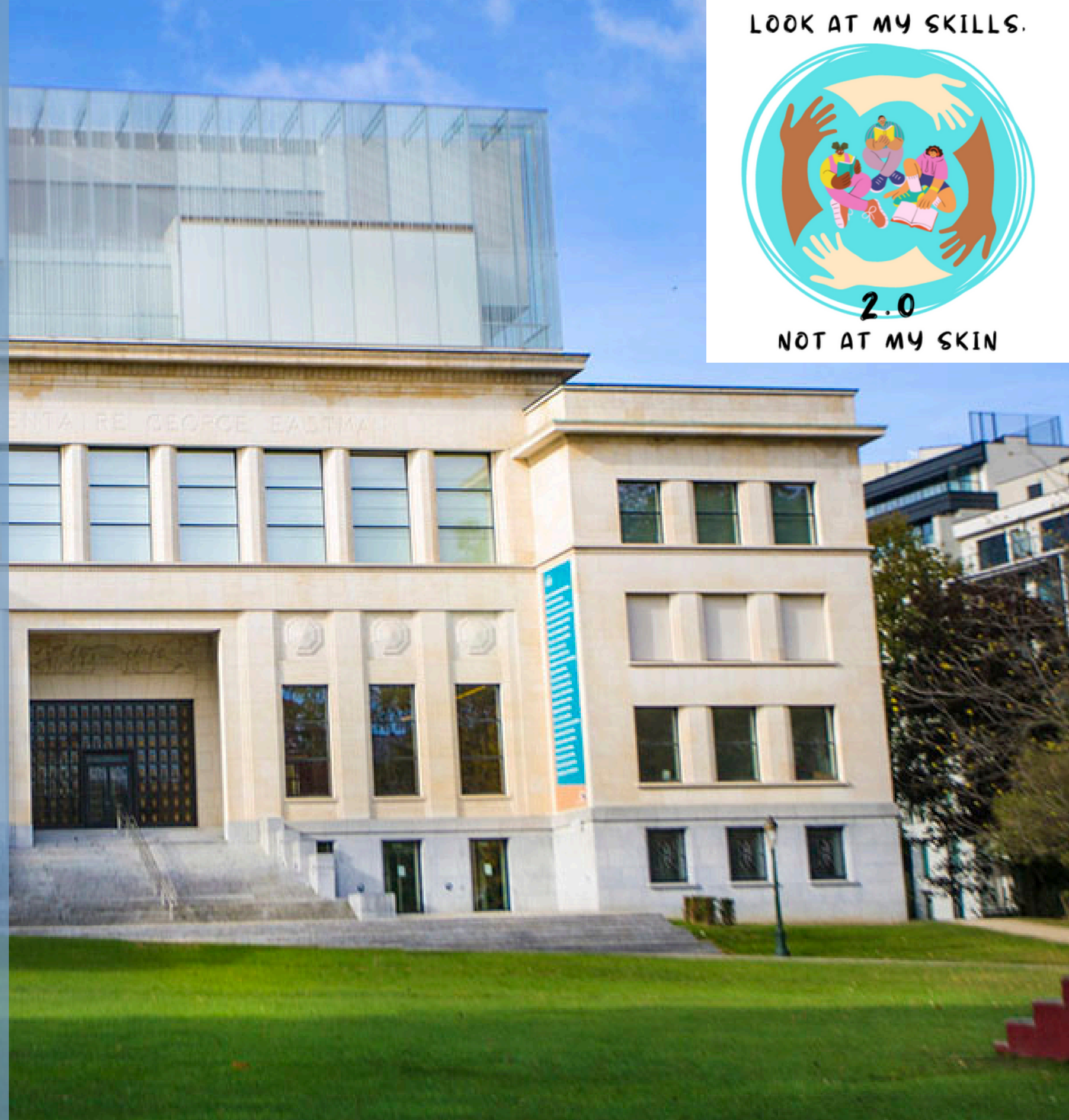

AN INFORMATIVE VISIT TO THE MUSEUM OF EUROPEAN HISTORY

They had an amazing educational experience in the museum participating in various educational activities that were offered. Each floor of the building represented a period of European history from renaissance from modern days.
